Kraków, Poland | 11–15 August 2019



1. Executive Summary

The 2019 World Congress of Surgery (WCS 2019) in Kraków convened **2,033 participants** from more than 80 countries, reinforcing its position as a premier global forum for surgical science and collaboration.

A total of **1,212 abstracts were submitted**, demonstrating strong international research engagement and scientific competitiveness. The congress facilitated high-level knowledge exchange, professional development, and cross-border partnerships, contributing to advancements in surgical practice worldwide.
